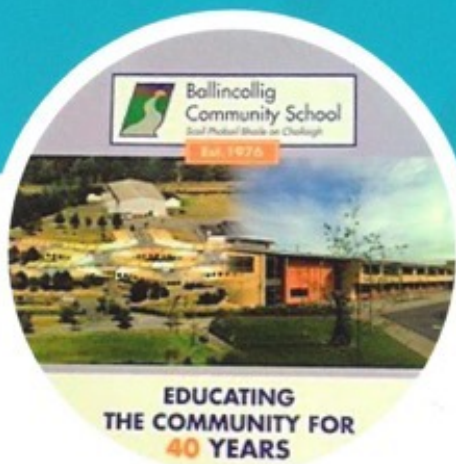

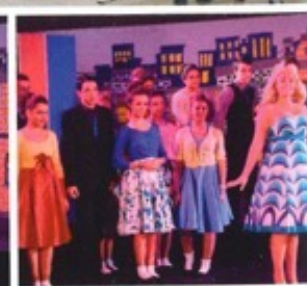
SCHOOL TOUR TO PARIS – TRANSITION YEAR

5th Year

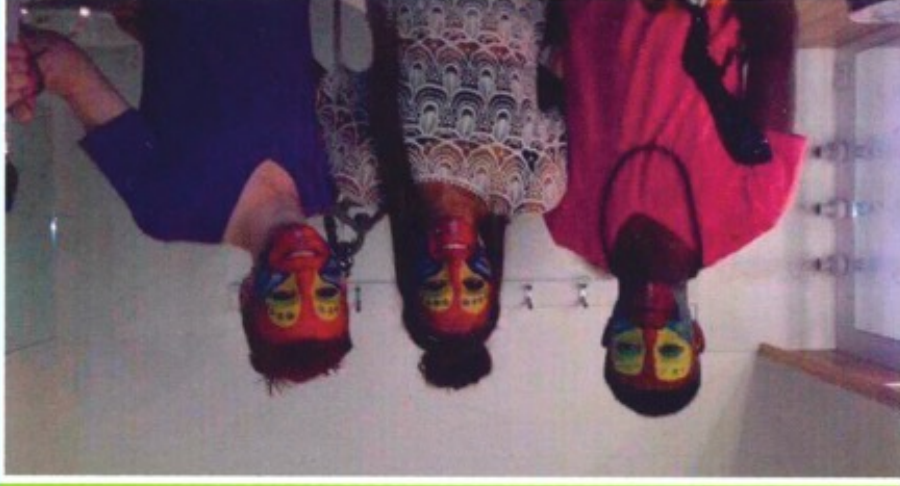
