### **Our Staff**


The teachers in BCS are highly dedicated, hard working and experienced. We have a proven track record of going above and beyond to help our students succeed academically.

# **Pastoral System**

The pastoral system at the school is geared towards respecting and building on the individual differences of every student. Each of the 6 year groups has a Year Head who, together with the class tutors, helps students integrate into the educational and social environment of the school. A Year Head is a staff member who coordinates a particular year cohort and a class tutor coordinates at class level. The Special Education Needs staff together with the school Chaplain and Guidance Counsellors, provide additional support.

# Wellbeing

Students will learn about the different aspects of wellbeing in the following subjects: PE, Social, Personal, and Health Education (SPHE); Civic, Social, Political and Education (CSPE). In addition, students will engage in one stand-alone class called 'Wellbeing class' per week, which offers students the opportunity to learn a variety of new topics and skills connected to current wellbeing themes. Examples include; digital awareness and internet safety; Microsoft office 365 training; nutritional studies; innovation education with the support of the Young Social Innovators Junior Programme and the Pieta House Resilience Programme.
